II Investigation Support Scheme

Investigation Support scheme provides financial support to new investigative projects, including projects that have only recently begun or new phases of existing projects. Teams can apply for between €5,000 and €50,000. The Investigation Support scheme expects to provide €800,000 in grants in 2020. Investigation Support grants are open to teams of journalists and/or news organisations based in at least two EU member states or at least one EU member state and one EU candidate country. Proposed projects must focus on a public interest topic of cross-border relevance and aim to reveal new information.

Deadline - June 14, 2020

Poynter's International Fact-Checking Network Grants

The International Fact-Checking Network (IFCN) opens applications for its newest grant program. IFCN has \$1 million in grant funding available for established fact-checking units that are pursuing projects around video production, tools

development, audience building, and new formats testing. Fact-checking organizations that are verified signatories of the IFCN's Code of Principles and/or organizations that have been regularly publishing nonpartisan fact checks over the last three months can apply. Fact-checking units may submit only one application for up to \$50,000.

Agora Europe Journalism Grants 2020

Funding is offered to freelance journalists based in Eastern and Southern Europe. Applicants must pitch a single story that they see missing in current news coverage. Additionally, they should provide information about how the Covid-19 crisis has affected them as a freelance journalist. 20 journalists will be chosen to participate in Program that will consist of two parts:

- Each of the selected journalists will receive €500 in emergency funding to use in whatever way they wish;
- Journalists will participate in a kick-off meeting and will be grouped into teams to work on a story topic for their region. A total of $\leqslant 3000$ will be distributed among the teams.

A European Public Sphere: New Online Media Offer for Young Europeans

This Call seeks proposals of consortia gathering at least 5 media organizations from at least 5 EU Member States, to produce daily, thought-provoking content from across Europe around current affairs, particularly targeting young Europeans. The total available budget is EUR 2,5 million. The maximum rate of cofinancing is 70% of eligible costs. Applicants may propose a lower co-funding rate. The Commission expects to fund up to 2 proposals.

Covid-19 Emergency Fund for Journalists

National Geographic Society is launching an emergency fund for journalists all over the world covering Covid-19 at a local or hyperlocal level, particularly in underserved communities and/or populations at high risk or hit especially hard by the virus. The fund will distribute support ranging from \$1,000–8,000 USD for local, evidence-based reporting on the preparation, response, and impact of this global pandemic. Beyond reporting on medical and physical health related to COVID-19, National Geographic especially encourages reporting that covers social, emotional, economic, and equity issues.

Deadline - proposals will be reviewed on a rolling basis

The Pulitzer Center on Crisis Reporting is seeking proposals that develop innovative approaches to reporting on the novel coronavirus crisis using collaboration among journalists and newsrooms across national borders. This opportunity is open to all newsrooms and independent journalists.

Proposals will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

IWMF Journalism Relief Fund

Looking for women-identifying journalists who are experiencing significant financial hardship as a direct result of the pandemic. This fund will provide small grants of up to \$2,000 USD per request. However, special consideration will be given on a case-by-case basis to those who have greater financial need.

Proposals will be reviewed on a rolling basis.

Youth4Regions Competition for Young Journalists

Youth4Regions is a program to help journalism students and young journalists discover what the EU is doing in their region. As of today, they can apply to participate in the eponymous competition, and based on their application, 33 winners will be selected. They will be invited to Brussels during the EU Week for Regions and Cities expected to take place in October 2020, where they will be able to follow trainings, receive mentorship

from established journalists, work together with the latter in the pressroom and visit the EU institutions and media organizations.
