GRANTS/STIPENDS

Grants for Estonian, Latvian and Lithuanian media

Internews in collaboration with Baltic Center for Media Excellence in the framework of the project "Supporting Independent Media in the Baltics Action" funded by the US Department of State announces a call for applications and invites local media outlets based and registered in Estonia, Latvia or Lithuania to apply for a grant.

The aim of the call is to support production of socially important stories. The stories must address pressing public interest issues in local community/region/country and must include multimedia elements. Experimentation with new formats is particularly encouraged.

This request for applications aims to fund and implement up to 18 projects all together in Estonia, Latvia and Lithuania. The amount of awarded grant will be up to US \$5,000. Application must be filled out in English.

Mobile Film Festival "Act now on climate change"

The Fellowship for Early-career Science Writers

One mobile, one minute, one film! How to do that? Write your screenplay. Topic: ACT NOW On Climate Change. Then shoot your film with a mobile or tablet device. The sound can be recorded separately. Then edit it. Enjoy the thrill of creating your own film. Golden rule: 1 minute maximum, including credits! Complete the registration form, upload your film to www.mobilefilmfestival.com, and wait for the Awards ceremony in Paris!

Two grants worth €20,000 each will be awarded to the winners of the Grand Prize France and Grand Prize International. These grants are designed to finance the production of a short film using professional resources within a year. The money will be given to an approved producer, who will take financial responsibility and ensure the film is completed.

The fellowship is open to early-career science writers with fewer than two years of professional science writing experience. (Internships and student work do not count toward this requirement). Graduate students interested in science writing are eligible. Prospective fellows must be available to devote sufficient time to completing articles as specified in the fellowship description.

During the eight-month fellowship period, fellows will report and write six articles for publication at The Open Notebook – a mix of "story behind the story" interviews and reported features – with the guidance of a mentor who will help shape story ideas, provide reporting and writing guidance, edit final copy, and offer career-development mentoring. The fellowship will be remote and will be part-time. Each fellow will receive a stipend of \$4,200.

The Logan Nonfiction Program offers two fellowship classes per year, and welcomes between 10-20 nonfiction writers, documentary filmmakers, photojournalists, podcasters and multimedia creators per class! Fellows are provided accommodation, meals, workspace, professional guidance and community.

Projects should examine the most pressing issues of the day, including but not limited to: conflict and security; democracy and governance; education; environment and climate change; food security; gender, race, sexual orientation, disability and intersectionality; globalization; health; inequality and exclusion; media and journalism; social justice; and sustainability and resilience. Are you interested? Applicants must be at work on a long-form project in order to apply (e.g.: an article, book, film, collection, podcast, etc.).

Chevening Scholarships now open for applications

Reporting Democracy offers a limited number of reporting grants to journalists in Central, Eastern and Southeast Europe to pursue in-depth features or investigations on issues affecting democracy in Visegrad Four countries and the Balkans.

Two types of grants are offered:

- 1. for in-depth features, investigations or analysis articles that do not have a substantial cross-border element. The amount of the grant depends on the complexity of the project.
- 2. for individual journalists or teams with ideas for in-depth features or investigations with a substantial cross-border element (and preferably a multimedia element too). The amount of the grant depends on the complexity of the project too. Reporting Democracy story grant proposals should be developed independently by applicants.
