Professional journalists who have an idea for research on European stories can apply for funding.

Journalismfund.eu organises the 2022 European Cross-Border Grants to support cross-border investigative journalism in Europe.

The grants are intended for teams of professional journalists from at least two different countries in Europe.

A total of EUR 200, 000 will be distributed over four rounds. Teams can also apply for a mentor to provide assistance during the investigation.

Reagan-Fascell Democracy Fellowship open

Journalists worldwide who wish to learn more about democracy can apply for a fellowship.

The Reagan-Fascell Democracy Fellows Program, organized by the National Endowment for Democracy (NED), aims to enable democratic practitioners, scholars and journalists to deepen their understanding of democracy and enhance their ability to promote democratic change.

Fellows are expected to be in residence at the International Forum for Democratic Studies in Washington March 1 to July 31, 2023 or Oct. 1, 2023 to Feb. 28, 2024. Working knowledge of English is required to be eligible.

Each fellow receives a monthly stipend for living expenses, plus health insurance and reimbursement for travel.
