Career professionals from a variety of related fields are welcome to apply. Past fellows include journalists from local, national and international TV, radio, print,

and digital media; media and civic technology innovators; nonfiction authors;

documentary filmmakers; political advisors and policymakers; leading academic scholars in fields such as media research and political science; and policy analysts.

Fellows receive a stipend of \$40,000 per semester, paid in monthly installments at the end of each month of their term. Travel, housing, and living expenses are not covered by the Shorenstein Center.




